Year 1 and 2 - Curriculum Overview and Homework Activities





Our learning

This term, our topic is 'I'm a survivor!'.

During our English lessons, we will focus on traditional tales and narratives from familiar authors with a survival theme including 'The Ugly Duckling' by Hand Christian Anderson and 'Stick Man' by Julia Donaldson. The chosen engaging stories all convey important messages about resilience, resourcefulness and the will to overcome challenges.

During Maths lessons, we will focus on the cornerstone concept of place value. Understanding place value is crucial as it helps children grasp the value of each digit in a number which is fundamental to all future maths learning..

In Science, we will explore how various animals and plants adapt to their environments, demonstrating their incredicble survival skills in the wild.

In Geography, we will be locating and exploring both human and physical features in our local area, helping us understand how these elements shape our community and environment.

Computing lessons we will further explore how to stay safe on the internet, linking this back to and building upon our prior learning.

In Art we will explore the work of Andy Goldsworthy and Walter Mason using natural objects as our inspiration for creating landscape art and printing using leaves.

Reading every night is the most important thing you can do to support your child with their learning. Use the books sent home and the e-book library to support with this. There are weekly spellings to learn as well as TTROCKSTARS and time tables practice. We also set weekly Maths homework—your child will be given a sheet to stick in the homework book ready to complete each week.

Survival Skills Research Research a specific survival skill, such as finding water or navigating by the stars. Write a step-by-step guide on how to perform this skill.	Create A Rescue Signal. Design a creative rescue signal using natural materials or household items. Draw or make the signal and explain how it would help rescuers find you in an emergency.	Survivor Interview Interview a family member or friend who has experienced a challengeing situation. Write down their story and what they did to 'survive' and overcome the challenge.	Survival Map. Create a map of your local area and include potential shelter spots, water sources and landmarks to help guide you safely home. .
